



## 2011 READING CAMP

**Reading Camp** is a camp week to help children who are reluctant, struggling readers improve literacy skills and become more confident students. Skills that help children become better and more confident readers is woven into a fun, full week of camp activities led by reading specialists, recreation leaders and college-aged cabin counselors.

**Reading Camp** does not “look” or “feel” like school. The setting and teaching tools are new to children. Each child is helped to read books at their choosing, encouraged to develop a love of reading, and given tools for reading proficiency. Children receive personal attention in a “failure free” setting.

### SKILLS LEARNED AT READING CAMP

Campers participate in six half-hour learning workshops each day —writing, fun reading, phonics, encoding/decoding, reading comprehension and reading strategies. The rest of the day is doing “camp activities” including swimming, canoeing, games, arts & crafts, special speakers, music and campfire programs. Reading Camp also has visits each week from special guests— authors or storytellers.

**READING CAMP offers:**

- One teacher for every 3 campers
- A relaxed and fun camp setting
- Quality reading material
- A creative approach to reading
- Literacy skill development

**Reading Camp** is for students entering 4-6 grade and are reluctant readers who are struggling with literacy skills, not reading at grade level or keeping up with their peers, and are recommended by their teachers.
